ACTIVE COMMUNITIES Two Communities To Focus on Getting Active!

ME ALINE WSP sought expressions of interest from Communities in Waterford to pilot this new initiative with the key aim to increase physical activity in a targeted community. The concept of the 'Active Communities' is to enable local communities to develop and implement locally relevant plans to increase participation in physical activity.

Two communities, Dunhill, Fenor, Boatstrand, Annestown Community (DFBA) and Knockanore, Glendine, Kilwatermoy Community (KGK) were selected as the successful communities to pilot this initiative in Waterford. Both communities to date have formed their local Active Community teams with representation from key people in their communities. WSP staff are currently working with the local teams in identifying the needs, barriers and current participation rates and developing an action plan for both communities. The key focus of the Action plans will be on increasing physical activity levels in their community and each plan will endeavour to meet the needs of their own community.

In addition expressions of interest will be sought from sports clubs in each community to participate in the WSP Club Development Programme. The aim is to assist the selected clubs with the formulation and implementation of a development plan. The concept of the Club Development programme is to encourage clubs to look at their overall structures and methods of coaching, administration, supports, volunteers, fundraising etc.

Older Adults Festival Faithlegg 2006 A great Success!!

The course was aimed at those working with or involved with people with a disability and aimed to increase opportunities for people with disability to participate in water based exercise by training assistant teachers.

The course helped participants to understand the basic health and recreational benefits of swimming and learn the basic principles of floatation, resistance and propulsion. A wide variety of teaching methods were explored throughout the course.

Buntús Start

Waterford Sports Partnership roll out exciting new physical activity programme for pre-school sector

Waterford Sports Partnership have just completed the roll out of the pilot phase of an exciting new physical activity programme for younger, pre-school children, called Buntús Start. This programme will complement the Buntús programme which Waterford Sports Partnership has already implemented in every primary school in Waterford.



Buntús Start is a comprehensive physical activity programme for children aged 2-5 years old.

It has been designed for use in pre-school settings so that pre-school and playgroup leaders can provide a wide range of learning opportunities for young children to develop their fundamental motor skills, manipulative skills, co-ordination and balancing skills and develop a positive attitude to physical activity.

Buntús Start helps adults working with children to establish positive attitudes to activity and a healthy lifestyle through enjoyable activity with children. Numeracy and literacy skills are developed in tandem with the childrens' development through fun physical activities.

The Buntús Start Programme commenced in Waterford City and County in June 2006 in six childcare centres. It is envisaged that further centres will join the programme in 2007/2008.

Each Centre was asked to send all their staff to an initial four hour training and through an interactive session they learned to use the resources given to them at the end of the training. A large bag of colourful, child-centered equipment (pictured below) and



comprehensive resource cards (pictured opposite) was given to each centre. There will be a two hour 'follow-up' training for all these centres in the Autumn. All childcare centres will be invited to apply to receive the programme later this year.

The participating childcare centres were; Williamstown Community Childcare Centre, First Steps Creche, Ballybeg, Tiny Tots Playgroup, Dunhill, Ladybird Daycare Centre, Tramore, Kill Montessori Community School, and Naíonra Choill MhicThomáisín.

Secondary Schools — Camogie Blitz

Waterford Sports Partnership were delighted to partner with WIT and Cumann Camogaiochta na nGael for a Camogie Blitz held in WIT in April this year. The event was a huge success and this was largely due to the committed team of volunteers in WIT who brought the organisation of this event from a proposal to a successful day of camogie enjoyed by hundreds of schoolgirls.

The event was organised to promote camogie and indeed has introduced many new players at school and club level to the game. 16 secondary schools across Waterford County, Kilkenny and South Wexford together with 23 teachers and mentors got involved in this exciting



event.
